


This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

FELLOWSHIP/COFFEE HOUR: Hello there! Are you thinking about signing up to provide refreshments for Coffee Hour, but you hesitate because you have questions about what to bring, what to do, or how to do it? Here are a few tips and ideas to get you started.

First, the kitchen is stocked with paper products, as well as coffee, tea, hot chocolate, sugar, creamer, etc. You can bring your own supplies if you like, but it isn't necessary.

Next, if you're not sure what type of refreshments to bring, the answer is "anything you like". And you don't even have to cook! Let the grocery store do the prep for you. A tray of fruit or a veggie platter from the produce aisle, pre-sliced cheese and crackers from the deli, or some bakery department mini-muffins or bagels would be perfect. If you *like* to cook, you could bring a breakfast casserole, a quiche, a pot of soup with some bread and butter, or anything you like. It's *totally* up to you!

If you need help getting everything set up the first time (or *any* time), or you would rather not go it alone, please ask for help or team up with someone. Or maybe you just need a quick orientation as to where everything is stored, where we hid the light switch, or how the oven works. We can help you with that, too!

Finally, please try to leave the kitchen like you found it. Pack up your leftover food to take home, or give it away as people are leaving. (Maybe someone is visiting a shut-in who would like a plate of goodies!) Empty the coffee pots and filter baskets and rinse them clean, unplug the coffeemakers, and put away any supplies that were not used. Wash, dry, and put away the dishes or utensils you used, wipe the counters and tables, and hang up used linens to dry. And voila! You did it!! (If you'd like to go an extra mile, pull the trash bags and put them in the cans outside, and replace with new bags.)

Not acceptable - Any baked goods that would promote rapid growth of bacteria.

Such items include – Cream Pies, Custards, and Custard pies, Pumpkin Pies, eclairs, creampuffs, meringue, cheese icing, cheesecake, "no bake" cookies, potato candy, baked goods may not be decorated or garnished with fresh fruits or vegetables.

Acceptable Baked Goods – Cakes, cookies, breads, muffins, pastries, brownies, two crust berry pies, rice crispy treats and popcorn. Fudge is acceptable if it prepared in a certified kitchen and kept under refrigeration prior to selling.

Packaging Instructions - It would be greatly appreciated if your baked items were prepackaged -

- Four medium size cookies to a Ziplock Snack Pack
- Two medium size brownies to a Ziplock Snack Pack
- Plastic Clam Shells are available in the Parish Kitchen if you need them.

Be sure to fill out a form below for EACH Item baked with Your Name, Name of Item, check all items contained in the baked item and mark if they are Sugar or Gluten Free.

Please have them filled out and on your item when you deliver them to the church. Extra Forms are available in the narthex of the church if needed.

Please bring baked items to the Parish Hall on the morning prior to the start of the event.
